Tonight's Music

Anthem for Winds and Percussion. Claude T. Smith
Bright brassy fanfares, dancing woodwind lines, and a lyrical middle section
make this piece a great "opener" for tonight's concert.

Hebrides Suite Clare Grundman
Four musical pictures of Scotland: The Peat-Fire Flame, An Eriskay Love-Lilt,
The Milking Song, and The Road to the Isles.

Rhapsody on a French Hymn. David Gorham
The hymn is entitled "Picardy", or "Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silent".
The composer presents the melody, and then lets his musical imagination roam free.

Sonatina for Band Frank Erickson
Erickson wrote some of the most important music for young school bands
in the 1950's as school music programs developed. This short three-movement sonatina
shows his gift for melodies and use of different groups of instruments.

Morning Song John Harmon
The melody is quick and light-hearted: imagine a fresh summer morning by a lake!

Three Czech Folk Songs Johnnie Vinson
In three separate movements, the composer presents three tuneful melodies
from the Czech Republic: "Walking at Night", "In the Meadows Green", and "Spring"

Blue Goose Rag. Charles L. Johnson, arranged by Timothy Broege
Broege stumbled across this piano piece, and adapted it for the concert band.
A catchy tune, and toe-tapping rhythms -- everything you need from ragtime!

Quaere Verum. Carl Strommen
Another big brass fanfare, and a melody like an Irish reel, plus a middle section
in the style of an English processional march.

Ceremonial Dances: "Fortune My Foe" Greg Danner
The fourth movement of Danner's suite of Renaissance dances.
